

The Annual Meeting was called to order by Chairman Danen at 7:00 p.m. Board members present were Chairman Phil Danen, Supervisors Renee Van Rossum, Ken Geurts, Cullen Peltier, and Mark M. Danen. Ledgeview Sanitary District Members present were Ken Geurts and Dennis Watermolen. Town Staff present were Administrator Sarah Burdette, Treasurer Renae Peters, Town Planner Dustin Wolff, Town Engineer Scott Brosteau, Public Works Director David Strelcheck, Public Works Crew Superintendent Andy Tenor, and Clerk Charlotte Nagel. There was a total of 27 electors present including Town Board Members and staff.

The 2018 Annual meeting minutes were posted on the Town website and paper copies were made available at the sign-in table as residents walked in. MOTION by Dennis Watermolen (4180 Oak Ridge Circle) to dispense of the reading of the 2018 Annual Meeting Minutes and to accept the minutes as written. Motion was seconded by Dan Kerkhoff (3848 Dickinson Road). No further discussion. Motion carried unanimously in a voice vote.

Paper copies of the 2018 Annual Report were also available on the sign-in table for residents to take and review as they walked into the meeting. Town Treasurer Renae Peters gave an overview of the report and answered any questions. She also advised that if anyone had any additional questions regarding the report they should contact her at ext. 101 and she would be happy to answer any questions. MOTION by Andy Tenor (3851 Dickinson Road) to accept the Annual Report as written. The motion was seconded by Ron Van Straten (3551 Wayne Lane). No further discussion. MOTION carried unanimously in a voice vote.

Staff explained that Brown County matches the amount of money the Town puts into the County Bridge Fund and that the fund can be used to finance replacement of culverts 36 inches in diameter or greater. With that said, this year the recommendation is to \$150,000 into the County Bridge fund for bridge and stormwater maintenance. MOTION by Dan Kerkhoff (3848 Dickinson Road) to put \$150,000 into the County Bridge Fund. The motion was seconded by Bill Vande Yacht (4151 Ledgecrest Trail). Motion carried unanimously in a voice vote.

The meeting was opened for public input and action at 7:12 p.m.

Eric Dvorak, 1404 Angels Path – Explained the flooding that took place on Angels Path this past spring, wondering there was going to be any solutions put in place?

Staff advised that the Town is aware of the flooding in the Angels Path area and are looking at possible solution with regard to stormwater management.

Bill Vande Yacht, 4151 Ledgecrest Trail – Mr. Vande Yacht owns 17 acres on Monroe Road (CTH GV) near the new Lexington development and inquired on the development plans for that area as he would like to see some businesses/commercial along the entrance corridor. Mr. Vande Yacht was told to bring forth some plans for staff to review.

David Wheeler, 3683 Half Crown Run – Is concerned with the curve on Euro Lane. States the curve creates poor visibility, is hard for larger vehicles such as school busses and garbage trucks to maneuver, and the black top is starting to fail. Inquired if there were plans to widen the Euro Lane and possible re-paved.

Staff will look at the situation and gather some feedback from Advanced Disposal, the Town's contracted hauler, to see what options are available.

Kathy Stock, 1620 Hawthorne Heights – Is upset about the proposed Scray Hill Road sidewalk from Dickinson Road to Scray Hill Park; she doesn't want it, and would like the Board to listen to Town residents who elect them.

The Board advised that the residents along Scray Hill Road approached the Town about creating a safer environment along Scray Hill Road for pedestrians, bicyclists, and to remove the dump trucks. Scray Hill Road is somewhat of a

challenging road because it's a border road with the Town of Glenmore, so Ledgeview owns half and Glenmore owns half. Regardless, the sidewalk would be to promote connectivity with Scray Hill Park and to do it in a safe manner.

Dan Kerkhoff, 3848 Dickinson Road – Asked about the proposed round-about at Dickinson Road and Scray Hill Road. Mr. Kerkhoff doesn't recommend the Town pay for that round-about itself; would like to see the county get involved.

The Board answered that there's development happening there which is driving the installation of the round-about. The intersection also falls within Tax Increment District #2 (TID), so there is a possibility that TID money could be used to pay for the round-about. There's no urgency with the round-about, but staff will take a good look at it.

Pat Van Rite, 4295 Main Street – Asked about curbside garbage services. Wondering where the Town is at with providing garbage services vs. contracting it.

The Board advised that the Advanced Disposal's contract is up next fall, and that they would be looking at options at that time.

Phil Danen, 4548 Stillmeadow Circle – Town Chairman, spoke of the lift station incident that happened on March 14, 2019. Basically the lift station was about to be submerged by flood waters which would have wiped out the entire Town's ability to have safe drinking water. There would have also been sewage seepage into basements and streets. The Public Works Crew worked tirelessly to successfully save the lift station. The Board is very proud of the Crew's work and is very appreciative as well.

After three additional calls for comments for other Town business as permitted by law, none were heard. At 7:36 p.m., Public Input and Action was closed.

MOTION by Ken Geurts (1962 Old Valley Court) to set the 2020 Annual Meeting for Tuesday, April 21st at 7:00 p.m. Seconded by Renee Van Rossum (845 Lone Oak Road). MOTION carried unanimously in a voice vote.

Chairman Danen recognized Supervisor Ken Geurts for his work as a Town Board Supervisor, Chair of the Personnel & Finance Committee, and Sanitary District Commission Member. A plaque was presented to Mr. Geurts as he stepped down.

At 7:36 p.m., the newly elected officials were sworn into office. They are Chairman Philip J. Danen, Supervisors Cullen Peltier and Al Cheslock, and Constable Pat Van Rite. All are serving for a two-year term, ending April, 2021.

MOTION by Phil Danen (4548 Stillmeadow Circle) to adjourn. Motion was seconded by Ken Geurts (1962 Old Valley Court). Motion carried unanimously in a voice vote. Meeting adjourned at 7:42 p.m.
